

Board of Elders Minutes

January 2, 2012

<u>Members Present</u>: Rev. Don Griffin, Dwight Deal, Cindy Johnson, Karen Kapp, Bobbie Reid, Dot Tucker, Natalie Johnson, Walter Carter; Absent: Pam Hensdale

Pastor Don opened the meeting reviewing prayer concerns, sharing a devotion based on Luke 11:1, followed by prayer.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

The Church secretary position has been filled by Dee McGee.

The Elders reviewed a "thank you for visiting & invitation-to-join" letter a church member had recently received after visiting another church while on vacation. Pastor Don will create a similar letter for the church office to begin sending to anyone visiting UCMC. Names of our recent visitors were discussed.

The Lovefeast & Candle Tea for Union Cross Academy (December 15, 2011) went very well thanks to the participation of many volunteers from the congregation. We will share with the congregation the numerous thank you notes that have been received from the students.

A thank you note received from Union Cross Academy (UCA) indicated the generosity of our congregation, and many others, for providing needed assistance to 60 UCA families. The surplus funds of the UCMC love offering have been used to purchase and donate clothing to the UCA school uniform clothes closet.

Dot Tucker was commended for getting <u>all</u> the Sunday School classes' to participate in the Christmas play presented at worship December 11, 2011.

The attendance at the Christmas Lovefeast & Candlelight service, December 18, 2011, nearly exceeded sanctuary seating. We discussed if the cost of future newspaper advertising was actually necessary and if increased advertising might necessitate a second service. Advertising ideas for the outdoor Easter morning Resurrection service (April 8, 2012) were discussed.

The Christmas day worship service was well-attended. A suggestion was made to continue the Lesson of Carols worship format for future Christmas day services.

Elders were asked to each complete a questionnaire prior to February 8, 2012 in preparation for the Provincial Triennial review, February 16, 2012.

Jack & Janice Reich have organized a "Painless Organ Donor" dinner, January 11, 2012, to help recover recent repair costs to the church organ. Surplus funds could be used to benefit other music ministries.

Karen Kapp has recruited volunteers to help with a pancake supper, January 18, 2012, to benefit the Share the Warmth of Kernersville Crisis Control ministry.

Debbi Butner of Forsyth Family Promise (ministering to homeless families) will meet with all UCMC volunteers on January 25, 2012, (7:00 pm) to begin organizing UCMC as a host/or/support congregation to Family Promise.

Church Council is scheduled immediately after worship February 5, 2012. Preparations were discussed including:

- Frequently remind the congregation to contact the nominating committee soon with their nominees to Elder,
 Trustee, and Graveyard Board.
- Pastor Don is to ask Phyllis Long to serve as a member-at-large on the nominating committee.
- The 5-Practices of Fruitful Congregations Celebration luncheon will be organized by Karen Kapp
 - Request church members to confirm their plans to attend the luncheon via the bulletin communication sheet (on Sunday, Jan 22 & Jan 29).
- Cindy Johnson will inquire if someone can provide childcare (movie in sanctuary?) during church council.

Joint Board Minutes

January 9, 2012

Pastor Don opened the meeting with a devotion based on 2 Corinthians 1:3, reviewed our prayers concerns and led us in prayer.

Barry McGee reported that the Building committee has been given permission to move forward with adding bathrooms to the Scout Hut. The total project budget is restricted to the \$11, 884 remaining in the Building Fund.

Dee McGee is the new church secretary. Her position and working hours will be announced to the congregation ASAP.

Debbi Butner will meet with all those who have agreed to volunteer (n=26) to assist Family Promise Ministry of Forsyth county on January 25, 2012 at 7pm. It has not been determined yet if UCMC will be asked to be a "Support" or "Host" congregation. Pastor Don asked that if UCMC is asked to be a Host congregation that it be approved by church council on February 5, 2012.

Barry McGee presented a brief financial review summarizing that above average offerings December 2011 reduced the budget deficit to ~\$58,000 (\$50,000 of which was the purchase cost of the Flinchum property).

Church Council will be February 5, 2012, following a <u>5-Practices of Fruitful Congregations</u> Celebration luncheon immediately after worship. The meal will be catered and served by the Joint Board. A donation jar will be available for the congregation to contribute to the cost of the luncheon. Cindy Johnson is working with David Long and Jeff and Amanda Griffin to arrange childcare (movie?) during the Church Council portion of the afternoon. In order to prompt the congregation to suggest nominees, a bulletin insert will be added listing positions & responsibilities to be filled and also asking for member to indicate their intent to attend the luncheon and Council. Timely phone tree messages will be made as well

Every effort will made to smoothly stream the business of the afternoon which will include:

 - New ministry opportunities
 - Recognition of each 5 Practices Ministry Facilitator
- Financial report 2012 Budget
- Elections of Elders (2), Trustees (3), and Graveyard Board (2)

- Trustee Motion to sell Flinchum property
- Motion to re-set Church Council date to last Sunday of January (January 27, 2013)
