Each saddens us and we miss them, but we celebrate the victory over death that they have been obtained through Jesus Christ our Lord, and their passing on to the joy of their salvation.


Trevor's death was a tragedy, oh yes, since so much of his life lay before him. However, in the midst of the anguish that was felt by everyone there that morning, I felt hope, love and the presence of the Holy Spirit in a very real way that morning. I've heard many sermons and words of inspiration from many pastors in this place throughout the years, but on that particular morning, Pastor Don gave one of the most powerful messages to date. God gave him the right words for the right time. I'm sure it is never an easy task to do funerals, especially one for a young man whose years on this earth ended long before we think they should. However, the Pastor's words seemed to ring from the rafters as he spoke to grieving parents, grandparents, relatives, friends, and especially to a grieving brother, as he spoke of God's grace, his mercy, his compassion, and above all, his love that knows no end.

As he spoke, I observed all of Trevor's young adult friends around me. Their attention was riveted on Pastor Don and what he had to say. They were listening intently; I pray they were "hearing". It is my prayer that all who were present were hearing the true message Pastor Don gave. Young or old, we all make important choices and decisions every day. God wants those choices to be made with our focus fully on Him.

A letter from the Church Mouse usually appears in the newsletter as a tribute to people whose deeds make such a difference in the life of our congregation, and sometimes go unrecognized. Since a church mouse can go about unnoticed, I am able to pass on such information and make the congregation aware of those individuals. On this occasion, however, this letter from the Church Mouse is simply to say, "Thank You" to our pastor, Don Griffin. I believe God used him in a special way to bring a message that not only comforted a grieving family and congregation, but inspired us to focus our every waking moment on the One who created us, sustains us, gives us hope, and who knows when we are in pain, and holds us in the shelter of his arms until we are comforted.

Thank you, Pastor Griffin, for being the instrument used to show us Jesus' face in the midst of our sorrow. Pastor Don always says, "To God be the glory." That is as it should be. We have a mighty God who deserves all the glory we can accord him. Amen.

# **Board of Trustee Minutes**

February 13, 2012

In Attendance: Beth Tucker, David Draper, Neil Doroshenko, Barry McGee, Dave Kapp, Karen Vaughn, Jeff Bondurant, Jerry Long, Lisa Willard and Pastor Griffin via cool cyber-link video. Newly elected members Dan Johnson and Charles Leonard were also in attendance.

The meeting was opened with prayer and devotion by Karen Vaughn.

Lisa Willard presented the financial report and the year got off on a positive note in January with income exceeding expenses. In was noted that January did consist of 5 Sundays.

David Draper and Karen Vaughn gave an update from the Schools Committee. The After School trash is now being picked up at the Flinchum property and they are also doing some self-cleaning – both items are saving money. A ½ day summer camp has been approved and the After School program continues to go well and profit is expected this year. Trustees agreed to look at the condition of the playground equipment on the next good weather Sunday. Motions were passed to put swings back up and to line off a soccer field.

The Pre-School is also going well and attendance is staying up. The playground area is in need of additional mulch and this will be addressed on the next church work day. No additional flooding problems have been reported. Trustees agreed to look into deglazing glass on the doors. Burner has been replaced on the oil furnace and it is functioning better.

It was reported that an individual has made a much appreciated donation to the church of heating oil.

A discussion was held on exterior church lighting concerns. Duke Power has presented a plan for additional lighting that will cost approximately \$1600 additional per year. It was decided to consider additional options and probably to wait until parking lot is redesigned and road project finished to further assess lighting needs.

Several items remain in the Flinchum house to remove. It was decided to keep the stove and refrigerator for now and dispose of other items.

Motion passed to convert both restrooms in sanctuary to unisex.

Update was given on the Family Promise ministry. Karen Kapp is heading the initiative and current plans call for a survey to better determine our role – host vs. support church.

Motion was passed to permit fund raisers at Lenten meals - donations for various causes.

Spring workday was scheduled for Saturday 3/31 and the rain back-up day will be 4/7.

Joint Board Retreat has been tentatively scheduled for 3/16-17.

Outgoing board members were thanked for their service and newly elected board members were welcomed.

Groundhog's Day has come and gone without any further sightings of the alleged church groundhog, leading to speculation that he or she has perhaps moved on to another denomination. No further reports from the board will be forthcoming.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:53 PM
