

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

At the 2014 synod of the Moravian Church Southern Province we adopted "Resolution 12," which called for "resources and a process for a conversation about homosexuality in the church that includes diverse viewpoints, and opportunities for open and honest discussion, study and discernment." On Sunday, October 4, 2015, from 4:00 – 5:30 p.m., we will host a forum to explore biblical, theological, and pastoral aspects of homosexuality and the church. In part the purpose of this forum is to gain an increased understanding of these aspects from different points of view. But the forum should also contribute to a primary goal of remaining a healthy church despite deeply held and differing convictions on homosexuality.

We are planning to open with worship led by our bishops (about 15 minutes), followed by two 15-minute presentations. Our speakers are the Rev. Susan Parker, former Assistant Pastor of Wake Forest Baptist Church, and the Rev. John Rankin of the Theological Education Institute. Brother Wayne Burkette will be our moderator. Following a short break, there will be a 15-minute question-and-answer period, where the questions should be for clarification rather than for debate. We will hold this conversation in a respectful and loving manner, as befits brothers and sisters in Christ, and we will wrap up our time together with worship.

Again, the forum will be at <u>4:00 p.m. on Sunday, October</u> <u>4, in the Shirley Recital Hall of the Fine Arts Center</u>, Salem Academy and College (enter at Salem Avenue and Martin Luther King, Jr, Drive). We are planning to videotape the event for later availability on the web, and we are also investigating the possibility of live-streaming for those who can't be present but would like to see it in "real time".

Please plan to come, listen and learn, and ask your questions of two very knowledgeable and thoughtful presenters.
