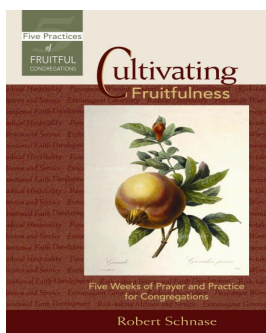

With the Class being small in number, we could use some support in staffing the closet throughout this year. The responsibilities are minimal:

- Unlock the appropriate doors at opening time.
- Greet any clients who come in and direct them to the type/size of clothing needed.

- Ask clients to complete a form giving their name and address, which we retain.
- Offer clients a Bible or children's story book before they leave.
- At the end of the second shift, take down the signs out front and lock up.

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## Board of Trustee Minutes

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March 12, 2012

Present: Barry McGee, Jerry Long, Charles Leonard, Ronnie Lauten, Dan Johnson, Beth Tucker, Jeff Bondurant, Paige Deal, Reverend Griffin

Absent: Karen Vaughn

The first order of business was election of officers for the year. The following were elected:

Barry McGee, Chair  
Jerry Long, Vice Chair  
Paige Deal, Secretary  
Dan Johnson, School Ministries Committee Representative

School Ministries - There was a discussion regarding the playground equipment at the Afterschool Building. Barry agreed to contact Dean Reid for an assessment of the playground's condition and whether it can be relocated closer to the pavilion.

Treasurer's Report - Lisa Willard, Church Treasurer, presented the financial statement for the period ending February, 2012. She reviewed various line items and responded to questions. It was noted that Year-to-Date income exceeds expenses by \$4,539.58. Ronnie advised that he has received some concerns regarding the location of the mowers, but no decision was made to change their current location from the Flinchum property. Barry will check on property tax deferral on the property. Barry and Dan volunteered to assist with the financial audit, which is due May 15, 2012.

Worship Announcement Volunteers - The next item on the agenda was volunteers to make announcements prior to worship service in coordination with the Board of Elders. Ronnie volunteered to make announcements for April, and Beth agreed to take a month but did not designate. Charles offered to serve as back-up if needed.

Quadrennial Review - The Board discussed the church's Quadrennial Review. Feedback from the PEC was generally complimentary, especially with regard to RCC involvement and number of ministries. There was some minor confusion regarding our church's study of Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations versus the 2010 Synod's strategic direction on Eight Characteristics of Healthy Congregations. Board members agreed that the church's Five Practices were embedded in the Eight Characteristics, so there was no true inconsistency between Union Cross' focus and the direction of Synod. David Guthrie, President of the PEC, will provide a summation for an upcoming newsletter.

Spring Work Day - The church's spring work day will be Saturday, March 31, with a rain date of Saturday, April 7. Certain tasks have been identified and volunteers/crew leaders are needed as follows:

Clean permanent floral arrangements

Clean residue from pews

Family Promise Ministry – Members of Family Promise's Board have visited the church and will provide an evaluation of our facility. Friedland has offered to assist Union Cross in a support role. A coordinator for this ministry is needed.

Shelving for Kitchen Storage Room – Shelves have been donated to the church. However, it was decided that they are not usable for the kitchen storage area and have been relocated to the Scout Hut to be used for storage. The Board voted to appropriate up to \$1,000 for the purchase of shelves for the kitchen storage area.

Joint Board Retreat – The retreat scheduled for March 16 and 17 has been postponed and will be rescheduled.

Sanctuary Restrooms – Gender designations have been removed from the restrooms in the Narthex of the church to provide use of either by males or females.

Sanctuary Ceilings – Charles will ask a professional sheetrock person to come and assess the condition of the ceiling and suggest repair options.

Narthex and Connecting Hallway Carpet – Board members agree that the carpet in these two areas is especially worn and unsightly. Barry and Ronnie will check on options to replace.

Red Cross Shelter Agreement – Barry presented a long-term agreement with the Red Cross for Union Cross to serve as an emergency shelter if needed. The Red Cross has sent a survey to update its database of resources. It was decided to take no action at this time regarding this, pending the results of the evaluation by Family Promise.

Cleaning Service – Barry will review the quote from Five Star Cleaning Service. It was noted that there were some performance issues which will be brought to the company's attention.

Church Clutter – Beth reiterated an on-going concern with clutter throughout the church. Items are being improperly stored and various ministry groups are urged to maintain supplies and/or resource material in a more orderly fashion.

Ministry Opportunities – Reverend Griffin commented that there are countless opportunities for ministry work throughout the church. For example, the Praise Service Leadership could use a couple of volunteers to help set up and break down the equipment each Sunday. Even small commitments of time can produce big results.

Road Improvements – Charles stated that he has been advised by NCDOT that road construction is scheduled to begin April 16.

There being no further business at this time, the meeting was adjourned.

**Board of Elder Minutes**  
March 5, 2012

Members present: Rev. Don Griffin, Bobbie Reid, Dwight Deal, Walter Carter, David Long, Sylvia Ridge, Cindy Johnson, Karen Kapp; absent: Pam Hensdale.

Rev. Griffin read a devotional based on Matthew 21:22, and the numerous prayer concerns of the congregation were updated before prayer.

Dwight Deal was elected to continue as the Elder's Vice-Chair. Pam Hensdale was nominated to continue as the Elder's secretary. Rev. Griffin will contact Pam to see if she will accept the nomination.

The Joint Board retreat will be held March 16-17 (most likely at the church). The retreat will focus on expanding and developing the ministries and ideas brought forward by the congregation's responses to "5 Practices of Fruitful Congregations".

Each Elder received a summary of the PEC's Quadrennial review which took place February 16. The summary will be discussed at the next meeting.

Permission was granted for a portion of the backyard of the Flinchum house be structured and marked off as a small soccer field for the use of the After-School ministry and the children of the church. Tyler Hensdale will organize the project in memory of his late brother, Trevor.

Debbi Butner of Family Promise of Forsyth has been notified of UCMC's request to become a host congregation of their ministry. Their organizing committee will visit UCMC later this month to look over our facilities and help determine how we can accommodate this ministry. A Fire Department inspection of the designated areas will be required as well.

Union Cross has been invited to participate in the second annual community "Moravian Festival" organized by New Philadelphia Moravian on September 8, 2012. Our participation is a chance to inform others of the many ministry opportunities at Union Cross – who we are and what we do. A request for UCMC volunteers will be listed in the bulletin.

Permission was granted to a request from the American Red Cross to renew our contract to allow UCMC to be used as an emergency services location in case of disaster.

A love offering will be collected on Sunday, March 25, 2012 as benevolence for Annette Overby's medical costs.

The Hospitality ministry has recently received a commercial-sized gas grill which was funded by several donors. The new grill will be located at the new picnic pavilion and stored in the Scout hut. The committee is also in the process of updating the visitor information brochure.

The responsibilities of the "Elder of the week" were reviewed, which include contacting new prayer concerns and collecting information from communication sheets placed in the offering.
