Reverend Griffin participated in the meeting via internet connection.

Dan Johnson participated in a portion of the meeting via telephone connection.

Guest: Dwight Deal

Karen Vaughn opened the meeting with devotions.

Paige made a motion that the agenda be taken up in two parts: first, old business to be considered by the current Board members and then new business to be considered by the reconstituted Board. Upon second by Charles, the motion was unanimously carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Lisa presented the financial statement for the period ending January 31, 2013.

Schools Committee – Barry advised that Dan Johnson, Dwight Deal, and Pam Hensdale served as the interviewing committee for the After-School Director and Assistant Director positions and via e-mail, Dan offered the recommendation to extend an offer of promotion to Jolene Cote for the director position (\$12.00 per hour) and extend an offer to Magan Gaskins as assistant director (\$9.25 per hour). Dwight confirmed the committee's recommendation and added that the interviewing committee recommends the following formal policy to be effective immediately:

After School Program Tuition Discount Policy

The director, assistant director, and adult counselors of the After School Program working at least 60% of the program's operating hours will be allowed a 100% monthly tuition discount for <u>one</u> dependent child. No other costs will be waived, i.e. enrollment fees, field trip expenses, etc.

During the 2012-2013 school year, 60% of operating hours per month range from 51-71 hours per month.

Barry made the motion for approval of the hiring recommendations and the proposed policy. The motion was duly seconded by Jeff and unanimously carried. Dwight excused himself from the meeting.

<u>Praise Worship Leader Interview Committee</u> – Jeff agreed to serve on the interviewing committee as a representative of the Trustees. Sylvia Ridge will serve from the Elders.

<u>Pavilion Anti-Erosion Project</u> – Lisa advised that the last check written for the grading work around the pavilion was dated May of 2011. The church will be eligible to reapply for funding assistance for this project through the local Community Assistance Program in May of 2014.

Sanctuary Ceiling and Pulpit Lighting - No new information was presented.

Replacing/Painting Doors - The Board continues to seek qualified vendors for this work.

<u>Scout Hut Bathrooms</u> – The Board was advised that the church's building permit application has not yet come out of the County Permit Office. Several members of the Board expressed frustration with the delay of this project and urged its completion as soon as possible.

New Advent Star – Reverend Griffin will contact Max Brady about a workshop date (perhaps in April) and find out how many volunteers will be needed.

<u>Fundraisers 2013</u> – Barry presented a proposal for fundraising events to cover the costs of various improvements in the church sanctuary, such as new and replacement microphones, video screen, and permanent stage. After discussion, Dan (via telephone connection) made a motion to approve designated fundraising on an individual purpose basis. Expenditure of any funds raised will be approved by the Trustees on a case by case basis. The motion was duly seconded by Charles and unanimously carried.

Replacement Wireless Microphone – Beth made a motion to purchase. The motion was duly seconded by Charles and unanimously carried.

At this time, Barry stated that this concludes old business. Upon request from Dan, Barry will chair the remainder of the meeting with the first order of business being the election of officers and committee assignments. Karen excused herself from the remainder of the meeting.

<u>Plant Committee Request</u> – Sarah Draper has requested a special water hose to help with the maintenance of the flower beds. Beth made a motion to approve up to \$250 for the hose. Ronnie seconded the motion and it was unanimously carried.

<u>Spring Clean-Up</u> – The period Saturday, March 9 through Saturday, March 23 was designated as Spring Clean-Up in and around the church.

<u>Review of Custodial Checks Document</u> – Beth made a motion to delete language relating to review of offerings. The motion was seconded by Jeff and unanimously carried. Beth offered to revise the document and present it at the next Trustee meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Lisa presented the financial statement for the period ending February 12, 2013.

Schools Committee's: Penny Coggins stated Kristi Whittington will have a Tuesday and Thursday program this summer.

Praise Worship Leader Interview Committee: One application has been received. A closing date for applications was incorrectly reported. Applications are still being accepted.

March 4, 2013

Don opened the meeting with a devotional and prayer concerns were shared prior to his arrival.

SOP for supplementary buildings: Cindy Johnson has the existing SOP and has made some changes and will send it to Terry Tucker for the two of them to look at together before it goes to Trustees.

Bible Study: Average attendance has been around 30 people each Sunday. A survey was conducted and 12 people responded that they would like to start a study of Acts. Leaders will meet to map out how the study is conducted. Leaders are interested in having a nursery during Bible Study. It was suggested to advertise its availability on a temporary basis and see how it goes before committing to a larger program. It was also suggested that it may increase interest in Bible Study amongst the younger members of the congregation if a topical bible study was added in addition to just a study of books in the Bible. Breaking into small groups to allow people to choose which topic would be more relevant to them was also suggested.

Praise Ministry Leader: One resume has been received for the position of Praise Ministry Leader Janice Reich moved that we reconsider the position description. Sarah Draper seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. The Board members will look over the position description and suggest changes and have them returned before the end of March. During this time, the application deadline will be extended to allow time for other applicants to send in resumes.

Clothes Closet: Closet will be closed for the month of April to allow time for cleanup. Holy Week Readings: Don Griffin is looking for readers for Holy Week.

VBS: Amanda Griffin has obtained the material needed for Bible School from the Board of Cooperative Ministries. Lisa Willard has volunteered to assist Amanda.

Pastor's Request for Vacation: Don has requested the week after Easter off. Don will be gone Sunday April 7th and has requested that Steve Williams be asked to take the pulpit in his absence. The Board agreed to the request.
