

#### **Ministry Opportunities**

**Transportation Ministry** - Would you be willing to give a little of your time in the new "transportation ministry" of our church? We would like to provide members free transportation when they need a ride to church, to the doctor's, the drugstore or where ever there is a need. We would love to have enough drivers willing to help out that no one would be driving too often. Pray about this and see if you can help in this needed ministry. Please contact the church office if you are willing to help.

**Family Promise Ministry** – The church was recently contacted by a member of the Family Promise Board to advise us of new regulations which may strongly affect the entire Family Promise program. Host churches are no longer classified as overflow shelters for the homeless; rather, they are classified as primary shelters, for which code requirements are more restrictive. For example, the code requires homeless shelters to have sprinkler systems, which many churches (including Union Cross) do not have, and persons under the age of 18 cannot be admitted, which strikes at the very heart of the program.

The Board of Family Promise met with churches currently operating as hosts to notify them of the changes and the possibility of closing this ministry. The eight churches indicated their desire to continue with the program and three of the churches said they would be willing to let other churches use their facilities and host families there.

The Family Promise Board has put everything on hold for two weeks. After this time, the Board will meet again and decide how to proceed. We will be notified of their decision.

Please pray for this ministry and for a way in which Union Cross can serve.

**Clothes Closet Ministry - A** "**Risk-Taking Mission and Service**" **Opportunity.** One of the 5 Practices we just studied is "Risk-Taking Mission and Service." Below is a service opportunity for you and the only "risk" is that you may be blessed by helping someone else!

The Young Adult Class Clothes Closet is open to receive clients on the second Saturday of each month from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. For staffing purposes, we have divided the time into two shifts: 9:30 – 12:00 and 12:00 – 2:30. We like to have a minimum of two people to staff the closet for each two-hour shift.

With the Class being small in number, we could use some support in staffing the closet throughout this year. The responsibilities are minimal:

- Unlock the appropriate doors at opening time.
- Greet any clients who come in and direct them to the type/size of clothing needed.
- Ask clients to complete a form giving their name and address, which we retain.
- Offer clients a Bible or children's story book before they leave.
- At the end of the second shift, take down the signs out front and lock up.

#### **Board of Elders Minutes**

April 9, 2012

Rev. Griffin read a devotional, and numerous prayer concerns of the congregation were updated before prayer.

Information regarding grief counseling services available from Hospice of Forsyth County will be shared with the congregation via the newsletter and church office bulletin board.

Family Promise update – Jane Lawrence and Paige Deal have agreed to be co-coordinators of this ministry. They are hopeful a third person will join them as each share one portion of the ministry: 1) Meals, 2) Overnight hosting, 3) Setup & Transportation.

Moravian Festival update - Five people have volunteered thus far (Jane & Buddy Lawrence, Ronnie & Linda Sisk, Dot Tucker). They plan to attend an organizational meeting at New Philadelphia on April 29 and confirm UCMC's plans to be a part of the festival activities on September 8, 2012.

Catherine Jenkins has agreed to lead Vacation Bible School this year. She will begin seeking a VBS curriculum and recruiting volunteers.

The Elders' welcome Daniel Gossett's choice to join UCMC by Reaffirmation of Faith on May 13, 2012. Brayden Greene will be baptized that day as well.

Pastor Don will be on vacation April 10 – April 30. Worship services during that period will be conducted by the following groups:

- April 15 Mens Fellowship
- April 22 Adult Choir; Five anthems and scripture related to the Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations.
- April 29 Youth

The Elders discussed recent comments made to Pastor Don regarding the Praise Service. The Elders, by consensus, fully support the non-traditional worship ministry the Praise service continues to provide. Modifying the left front corner of the sanctuary into a "Praise band" space could create numerous benefits and less conflict with Traditional worship; i.e., less time to set-up, earlier start time (longer Praise service), and minimal repositioning of pulpit or communion table. The Elders will continue to work to develop the most joyous worship options for everyone.

A social worker at UC Academy has contacted Bobbie Reid regarding a request for direct financial help to a student's parent to pay an electric bill. The Elders recommended that the individual be directed to Crisis Control and Sunnyside Ministry at this time.

Bobbie Reid will work with Dee McGee to develop a new Communication sheet for the bulletin which would regularly list ministry opportunities and allow ministry leaders to quickly connect to every new volunteer.

The Joint Board retreat has been rescheduled for May 18-19 at the church. The retreat will focus on expanding and developing the ministries and ideas brought forward by the congregation's responses to "5 Practices of Fruitful Congregations".

The meeting was adjourned at 8:25 pm.

## **Board of Trustees' Minutes**

April 9, 2012

Barry McGee opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Lisa Willard, Church Treasurer, presented the financial statement for the period ending March, 2012. She reviewed various line items and responded to questions.

Assessment of Physical Condition of Church and Grounds – The board walked and scrutinized various physical needs of the church: vacant concrete pads from where the air conditioning units were stolen, the playground equipment located near the After-School/Old Fire Station building, the condition of the interior and exterior windows of the sanctuary, the carpet in the sanctuary narthex and nave, and the peeling paint on the ceiling of the sanctuary. Charles Leonard, Ronnie Lauten and Barry McGee offered to continue to request estimates on each segment of work and these projects will be prioritized. Barry will contact the Police Department and the insurance company.

There was a consensus among board members that portions of the playground equipment were dangerous and should be addressed as soon as possible. Dan Johnson made a motion to spend up to \$500 to make the playground safe, including removal or restructuring certain components. The motion was duly seconded by Charles Leonard.

After discussion regarding a more convenient location for the playground, Dan added in his motion to move the playground structure closer to the pavilion on an appropriate flat area. Charles seconded the amendment. The motion as amended carried unanimously.

Charles offered to check with Tim Smith about the reinstallation of the swings near the relocated playground.

<u>Worship Announcement Volunteers</u> – Barry stated that anyone who was willing to be in the rotation, please contact the church office.

<u>Spring Work Day</u> – It was reported that the March 31 workday was very well attended. Roger and Cindy Johnson have offered to rent a steam cleaner and put together a volunteer group to clean the upstairs hallway in the office complex, steps, classrooms, offices, hallway between the Fellowship Hall and the sanctuary, and the narthex.

<u>Joint Board Retreat</u> – Reverend Griffin briefly entered the meeting to announce that the Joint Board Retreat has been rescheduled for May 18-19.

<u>Family Promise Ministry</u> – This ministry is still in need of a lead coordinator. Jane Lawrence and Paige Deal have volunteered to assist.

<u>Kitchen Storage Shelves</u> – Barry advised that there may be some donated shelving available from the Southern Province due to a renovation project. He will follow up on this.

<u>Missing Band Instruments</u> – There are currently three missing band instruments. Barry will contact the Police Department to report these stolen.

<u>Sewer Service</u> – The church has received a letter from the City/County Utility Commission advising that sewer service is now available. This letter has been forwarded to the Building Committee. The board specifically requested that it be clarified and confirmed that the former Flinchum property and the After-School/Old Fire Station building will not tie into the offered sewer system at this time.

<u>Upcoming Sunday Worship Services</u> – During the absence of Reverend Griffin, Barry stated that upcoming worship services will be handled as follows: April 15 by the Men's Fellowship, April 22 by the Choir, and April 29 by the Youth.

Red Cross Shelter Agreement – No action on this matter was taken at this time pending the results of the evaluation by Family Promise.

<u>Church Treasurer</u> – Lisa Willard tendered her resignation as church treasurer effective June 30, 2012. As chair of the trustees, Barry accepted her written resignation and all members of the trustees thanked Lisa for her faithful service for many years.

There being no further business at this time, the meeting was adjourned at 9:12 p.m.

Barry McGee called this brief meeting after worship service to update the Board on the following items:

<u>Kitchen Refrigerator</u> – The refrigerator in the kitchen was not working and a service call determined that it needed a replacement coil at an approximate cost of \$300.

<u>Air Conditioning Units</u> – A couple of quotes for replacement have been received. Barry stated that this information would be assembled for Trustee review as soon as possible. The church's financial exposure is its \$500 deductible. The remaining cost will be covered by our provincial insurance policy.

<u>Pine Needles</u> – The church purchased 25 bales of pine needles during the recent sale by the youth group. The bales have all been spread at various locations around the church. Ten percent of the total proceeds from the sale will be returned to the church.

NCDOT Meeting – The NCDOT will hold a community meeting on Thursday, April 26, from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m., and Trustees were encouraged to attend if possible.

Worship Announcements – Beth Tucker offered to do announcements prior to worship service during the month of May.


