The meeting was opened by Reverend Griffin with devotions and prayer.

Reverend Griffin advised that Steve Marx will be in Winston-Salem and is available to speak at Union Cross during the Sunday School hour on June 23. Karen Kapp made a motion to invite Steve to speak on June 23. The motion was duly seconded by Charles Leonard and unanimously carried.

Reverend Griffin asked for possible dates for a Joint Board Retreat. After discussion, there was a consensus to review the minutes of the past retreat and discuss dates and retreat goals at the May meetings. The following suggestions were submitted as retreat topics:

### **Board of Elders Minutes**

April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2013

Members present: Rev. Don Griffin, Cindy Johnson, Karen Kapp, Sylvia Ridge, David Long, Janice Reich, Sarah Draper. Members absent: Pam Hensdale, Larry Espinosa.

- -The idea of having a visitor information sheet was presented to the Elders based on a few church members seeing this used at Friedland Moravian. A copy of Friedland's information sheet was distributed and the board members agreed that this would be a good thing to have for our church as well. The Hospitality Committee will be responsible for creation of the information sheet.
- -It was brought to the attention of the Board that Shepherd's Center of Kernersville was looking for names of shut-ins or infirm elderly to be placed in their telephone reassurance program. The program uses volunteers to call these people to check-in with them to make sure they are doing OK and to provide them a small amount of companionship. Board members were asked for names of people that would benefit. Don then suggested that we contact the people first to make sure they would want to be called rather than having someone call them without their prior permission. The Board agrees that we should ask the congregation to submit names for participation in the program. The bulletin and the newsletter will be used to collect names. Karen Kapp moved that we proceed with a second from Janice Reich. Board voted unanimously for approval.
- -Concerns were raised about how much the youth were participating in the church and how much visibility they had to the congregation at large. A suggestion was made to have the children do their worship time in the sanctuary every 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday. In conjunction with this the kids would have cans for collecting change from the congregation to donate to charity. The Board feels as though this will increase the connection between the kids and the congregation. Janice Reich moved that we institute this policy with a second from Sarah Draper. Board voted for unanimous approval. The 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays will occur in June, September, and December of this year. Janice also suggested that it would be a good idea to have the kids decorate the cans during Bible School. The Board also thought this would be a good idea.
- -A request was made to use the Fellowship Hall for a Pampered Chef Training Meeting, along with use of the projector. Karen Kapp moved to allow the use with a second from Sylvia Ridge. Board voted unanimously for approval.
- -Starting in the fall the youth will be split into two groups, with one group being middle school age and one group being high school age. A campaign will be initiated to let people know these new groups will be forming and that teachers will be needed.
- -A question was raised about the reopening of applications for the position for Praise and Worship Team Leader. After discussion by the Board, it was decided that applications for the position does not need to be reopened. Karen Kapp moved to not reopen with a second from David Long. Board voted unanimously to not reopen the application process. The position will remain closed and will be filled soon.

This meeting occurred immediately following the Joint Board meeting. Ronnie Lauten chaired the meeting in Dan's absence.

Financial Report - Ronnie advised that Lisa Willard could not be present tonight, so there would be no financial report.

Request for Mulch - In response to a request from Sarah Draper made during the Joint Board meeting, Charles Leonard made a motion to approve up to \$200 for mulch. The motion was seconded by Beth and unanimously carried.

<u>Solar Lights</u> – Jeff reported that he has purchased solar lights for the two entrances to the church parking lot off Union Cross Road. Charles Galloway offered to install them.

<u>Church Construction Log</u> – Jeff stated that a Construction Log notebook exists but is not up-to-date. He offered to organize it with tabs and warranties, etc.

<u>Pulpit Lights</u> – Reverend Griffin advised that he has the panels for installation of the pulpit lights, and will bring them on Sunday for the Trustees approval.

<u>Scout Hut Bathrooms</u> – Beth explained that she and Ronnie have talked to Tim Smith regarding this project. After discussion regarding items left in the Scout Hut, Jeff made a motion to donate all items except the appliances. The motion was seconded by Beth and unanimously carried. It was decided that the freezers would be sold to anyone who wants to purchase one, but the refrigerator would be kept for potential use in the renovated space.

<u>Kitchen Freezer</u> – Ronnie made a motion to allow Burton Whittington to purchase a new circuit board for the commercial freezer in the church kitchen at a cost of up to \$600. The motion was seconded by Penny and unanimously carried.

<u>Property Improvement Requirements due to Road Construction</u> – Charles Leonard reported that the church is not required to make any improvements at this time. Charles Galloway advised that at some point, the parking lot will have to be landscaped and restriped.

Beth offered to prepare folders for each Trustee regarding church campus property, i.e. plat map.

<u>Fundraising Request</u> – Beth made a motion to approve a quilt raffle fundraiser requested by Penny Coggins at the earlier Joint Board meeting for the purpose of a future project for Fellowship Hall bathroom renovations. The motion was seconded by Ronnie and unanimously carried.
