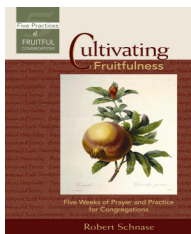

Board of Elders

Summary of Minutes - May 6th, 2013

Members present: Karen Kapp, Sarah Draper, David Long, Larry Espinosa, Sylvia Ridge, Cindy Johnson, Janice Reich, Don Griffin

Members absent: Pam Hensdale

Karen Harris opened the meeting with a presentation about a Gemeinschaft project as part of a spiritual growth program. The program will be a 40 week program with about 2.5 hours each week to build spirituality within a small group. It would begin around August 13th. Karen has asked that the board prayerfully consider commissioning of the program. Karen has volunteered to lead the program if the board is willing to adopt the program.

Don shared a devotional about servanthood and numerous prayer concerns were shared.

SOP for supplementary buildings: Cindy Johnson gave her updates to Dan Johnson and we are waiting on Trustee action

Bible Study: Will skip May 12th and 19th studies and conclude Book of Acts in the first week of June. An adult bible school class will be held during Vacation Bible School. Attendance is still high for Bible Study and no recess will be held during summer.

Praise Ministry Leader: We are in the process of finding a trustee to participate in an interview committee for the leader position.

Handbell Choir: Handbells are taking a break in order to find more people and a better practice time.

Clothes Closet: Closet was closed during the month of April for an organizational workday to switch out winter and summer clothes. The closet has plenty of inventory and new people have started volunteering at the closet. A plan is being implemented to limit the number of items people can take to curtail people taking advantage of the ministry.

Don Griffin has volunteered to call a Christian Education Committee meeting to reestablish regular meetings of the Committee.

Shepherd's Center Telephone Assistance Program: The program has been advertised in the bulletin but no names have been submitted.

Greeting Packet: The Hospitality Committee has nearly finalized the packet and will be printing the packet and putting in the pews in the near future.

Request from Afterschool: The afterschool has requested permission to create a garden and sell fruit from the garden. Motion was made by Sylvia and seconded by Cindy and approved unanimously.

Request from Praise and Worship Committee: Praise team wants to celebrate their anniversary with a lovefeast on May 19th at 6:30pm. Karen moves to allow and Larry seconds. Approval is unanimous.

Schools Ministry: Committee met and all reports were good for the preschool and afterschool.

Youth Sunday: The youth have volunteered to lead a Youth Sunday. Don will check the calendar and let the youth know when will be a good time for the next Youth Sunday.

Graduation Sunday: Don has set May 26th as graduation Sunday.

Board of Trustees Summary of Minutes - May 13, 2013

Present: Dan Johnson, Ronnie Lauten, Charles Leonard, Beth Tucker, Paige Deal, Charles Galloway, Penny Coggins, Mike Sisk, Reverend Griffin

Absent: Jeff Bondurant

Devotions - Ronnie Lauten

After-School Facility Inspection – Dan advised that many of the high priority items for energy savings have been completed, but there are a couple of remaining repairs that need attention. He noted that the interior of the building could be improved a lot by painting. Charles Galloway and Dan volunteered to purchase the paint since the Adult Fellowship Class has already offered to do the painting. Dan and Charles will check with Jolene (After-School Director) for paint color preferences.

Financial Report - Lisa Willard presented the financial statement for the period ending April 30, 2013, and responded to questions. She informed the Board that she has received a bill for Fair Labor Employment posters which are required by law to be posted. Reverend Griffin was asked to follow up with provincial staff to determine the requirements and verify the cost.

Scout Hut Bathrooms – Dan advised that he has discussed this project with Tim Smith who reported that 6 of 7 signatures required for the permit have been received, and he anticipated there would be no problem with the issuance of the building permit. This matter was discussed at length and Reverend Griffin offered to contact Tim to verify several points of discussion.

While Reverend Griffin was making his call to Tim, Dan received a copy of the schematic plan and stated he would have copies distributed to Board members.

In response to discussion regarding the \$11,000 budget for the Scout Hut bathrooms, Paige offered to research past minutes and present a timeline of motions and actions regarding the bathrooms. She also offered to check on the possibility of renting a portable toilet for use until the bathrooms are completed.

The Trustees proceeded with the agenda, but later in the meeting, Reverend Griffin returned after speaking with Tim Smith, Dave Kapp, and Ronnie Sisk by telephone. He reported the following:

- Tim is willing to coordinate the project but cannot be on site on a daily basis due to his work commitments.
- Required improvements include the cutting of walls and installation of three pushbar doors – one each on either side of the fireplace and one to replace the current garage doors
- Plumbing will be expensive and a reduced cost of \$5,000 was mentioned. However, that cost does not include certain required items

After considerable discussion, Dan requested that Tim Smith provide a work list to determine what can be done with volunteer labor and what needs to be contracted.

Charles Galloway made a motion to increase the budget for the project to \$20,000. The motion was seconded by Beth and unanimously carried.

Subsequent to the meeting, the Trustees engaged in a series of e-mails further clarifying and defining this project. Dan made a motion which was seconded by Charles Galloway and carried that the Trustees suspend any decision regarding the funds approved for the Scout Hut bathrooms until such time as a firm budget can be determined based on actual project costs.

Dan has prepared a draft document listing project components and expenses.

On May 23, Tim notified Dan via email that the plan has been approved and the permit will be picked up early next week.

Pavilion – Grass will be planted in the fall.

Sanctuary Painting and Lighting – Dan and Charles Leonard will follow up with Harold Day Painting for an updated bid on the painting work and confirm that the scaffolding will be available for the installation of the new lighting. Reverend Griffin offered to handle the electrical installation with the understanding that timing and coordination of work is essential to completing this project as efficiently as possible.

City/State Improvement Requirements – Nothing is needed to be done at this time, but Charles Galloway will follow up on requirements as the road project proceeds. Charles Leonard offered to meet with DOT engineers to determine driveway dimensions.

Microphone Replacement – Dan made a motion for approval of approximately \$450 for replacement of the receiver. The motion was seconded by Beth and unanimously approved.

Portable Public Address System – Beth has checked and tested a proposed PA system to be used by the church as needed, but especially for graveside services. She advised that the Women's Fellowship and the Graveyard Board will share the cost of \$550 (\$275 each).

Custodial Check List – The updated checklist is available and anyone who wants a copy should contact the church office.

Church Campus Folder – Beth is continuing to work on this.

Advent Star Replacement – Reverend Griffin will check with Max Brady regarding his availability to direct this volunteer project on either September 7 or September 15.

Joint Board Meetings – The board recommended that the Joint Board meet once a quarter on the 3rd Monday night (next meeting on June 17th) and that the Graveyard Board be invited to attend.

Church Council – A reminder was given that there will be a called special meeting of the Church Council on Sunday, June 2, immediately after the morning worship service to address the issue of a columbarium.

Interview Committee – Mike Sisk volunteered to serve on the Interview Committee for the Praise and Worship Leader position.

Church Office Computer – Dan made a motion to authorize the purchase of a new computer for the church office if a donation is not received by May 28. Beth seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

There being no further business at this time, the meeting was adjourned at 9:51 p.m.

RCC met at Union Cross Moravian Church on May 20th for the monthly meeting. The facilitator was Don Griffin. Devotions were lead by Dee McGee followed by prayer. Prayer concerns were mentioned such as Oklahoma tornado victims, Rylee Sink and other suffering from cancer.

Old Business:

- Friedland's community day was not well attended. The Mud Run for Sunnyside Ministries has approximately 70 participants.
- Pine Chapel has their Chicken dinner and raised \$1200 but it wasn't well attended either.
- UCMC recently had the plant sale and the Spaghetti luncheon and both seemed to be well attended and raised \$3000 total. The Praise and Worship Service Anniversary lovefeast went well however the attendance could have been better. For some reason this past Sunday's attendance during worship service at UCMC was very low.
- Wacky Wednesday: Friedland has volunteered to take charge and put this together. This will be geared for k-5th grade. Children under 5 can attend but only if a parent or guardian is present.

New Business:

- On June 9th the RCC will have a joint church get together to start off the Summer. It will be held at UCMC from 5:30 PM to approx. 8 PM. The Hospitality Committee of UCMC will provide refreshments.
